



2008 Summer Projects

Romania (May 23 – June 8) The Romanian military is open to the message of Jesus Christ and this is your opportunity to use your influence as a military cadet or mid. Invest 2 weeks before summer training or between jobs. We'll be serving Romanian cadets by teaching conversational English and leading discussions on leadership. Off campus, we'll build friendships, engage in cultural exchange, and share our faith. We'll also model ministry methods and techniques to the Romanian cadet leadership. This project is primarily for cadets, midshipmen, active duty, and guard/reserve students. You will be wearing your uniform when teaching. The focus is on relational evangelism born out of service.

Gettysburg National Battlefield (June 21 – July 12) Over 2 million tourists visit the Gettysburg National Battlefield each year. We will help the U.S. Christian Commission tell the story of faith in the Civil War by giving tours of their museum and helping with weekend and weekday Civil War chapel services. During the July reenactment, we'll participate as reenactors -serving as agents for the U.S. Christian Commission - telling the story of faith and sharing the gospel as we interact with the 20,000 plus tourists. We'll pass out civil war tracts to tourists and other reenactors, conduct Civil War field chapel services, and lead battlefield tours for the Boy Scouts. We're hoping to have a joint project bringing together college students, military academy cadets and midshipmen, and ROTC cadets.

Alaska 2008 (July 3 – 23) This men-only project is for cadets and midshipmen who want to fish, hike, explore, and learn how to build a spiritual movement among their fellow future officers. The focus is on how to be a spiritually fit leader on your military campus, in your ROTC unit, and as a new US military officer. The curriculum covers your personal walk, evangelism, movement-building strategies, working with missionaries in the bush, service projects in remote villages, & learning how to lead like Jesus.

Rocky Mountain High (6 one week sessions May 31 – Aug 2) Rocky Mountain High (RMH) is an outdoor adventure program hosted by Officers' Christian Fellowship (OCF) that focuses on Biblical principles and the character of Jesus as prime examples for leadership. RMH is open to all cadets, midshipmen, and campus staff who work with Valor. Taking place in Colorado's spectacular Collegiate Peaks Range, Rocky Mountain High is a unique program designed to impart to future officers the desire and ability to exalt Jesus Christ within the military community. Plan to climb a 14 thousand foot mountain, white water raft, mountain bike, hike, and mountaineer.
